# establishing the position to be adopted on behalf of the Community in the International Grains Council

# **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

The International Grains Agreement, 1995, is made up of two parts: the Grains Trade Convention, 1995 and the Food Aid Convention, 1995.

The Food Aid Convention of 1995 was renegotiated and covers the period until July 2002. The Grains Trade Convention, 1995 was extended in 1999 for two years. This Convention expires in June 2001 unless it is extended for a period of no more than two years. Since no changes to the current Convention are required, extension may be achieved by decision of the International Grains Council.

#### **Financial implications**

The EC-15 contribution to the administrative budget shown under item B7-821 of the European Union budget, will increase slightly in principal and at any event will not exceed the estimated level of 2002. On the contrary, a reduction of the contribution could be envisaged in case of new accessions to the Convention.

#### Conclusions

The Commission proposes to the Council to authorise the Commission to vote on behalf of the European Community in accordance with Article 33(2) of the Grains Trade Convention in favour of the extension of this Convention for the period from 1 July 2001 to 30 June 2003.

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community, and in particular Article 133 in conjunction with Article 300(2) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas:

The Grains Trade Convention, 1995 was concluded by the Community by Council Decision 96/88/EC<sup>1</sup>, amended and extended in June 1999 by Council Decision 1999/C262/01 for a two-year period<sup>2</sup>. This Agreement remains in force until 30 June 2001, unless it is extended beyond that date by decision of the Grains Trade Council for a period of no more than two years. The extension of that agreement is in the interest of the Community. The Commission, which represents the Community in the Grains Trade Convention, should therefore be authorised by a Council Decision to vote in favour of such extension.

#### HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

#### Sole Article

- 1. The European Community is hereby in favour of the extension of the Grains Trade Convention, 1995 for a further two-year period.
- 2. The Commission is hereby authorised to express this position within the Grains Trade Council.

# 5. DESCRIPTION AND GROUNDS

### 5.1. Need for Community intervention

Because of its economic importance, especially in the agricultural sector, the EC must be represented in international agricultural agreements, which represent an important means for following global developments and defending Community interests for the products concerned.

The payment of EC membership contributions enables the objectives of the International Grains Council to be attained. The International Grains Council, which is responsible for administering the Agreements, Grains Trade Convention, 1995 and Food Aid Convention, 1999, promotes the objectives of the Agreements, such as international co-operation, exchange of statistical information, forecasting market trends, etc. It is therefore in the interests of the EC to be a part of the Agreements.

The membership contributions are determined on an annual basis and are due for as long as the EC is a member of the Agreements and in particular for 2 years (1.7.2001 - 30.6.2003).

It is clear that if the EC had to carry out on its own the same actions as are carried out by the IGC, the total cost of these would be much greater than the cost of the membership contributions.

# 5.2. Actions envisaged and arrangements for budget intervention

The EC pays membership dues on an annual basis for the International Grains Council.

The dues are paid for as along as the EC remains a signatory to the Agreements and at present for 2 years (1.7.2001 - 30.6.2003).

The European Commission and the Member States participate fully in the activities of the IGC and take full advantage of the benefits of membership.
