

ADJUSTING THE WEIGHTINGS APPLIED TO THE REMUNERATION

AND PENSIONS OF OFFICIALS AND OTHER

SERVANTS OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES



EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Adjustment of remunerations of officials and other servants to the increase in the cost of living

The Council has been making half-yearly adjustments to remunerations in line with the increase in the cost of living since July 1971 on the basis of the methods for calculating remunerations adopted on 23 March 1972 and 29 June 1976.

The Statistical Office of the European Communities, in agreement with the statistical offices of the Member States and in conjunction with the OECD, has prepared joint indexes showing changes in the cost of living in the second half of 1978 in Brussels and in the various countries where staff are employed.

On 31 December 1978 (June 1978 = 100) the figures for the various countries were as follows:

The Commission therefore proposes that the weightings applicable to the remuneration of officials in the various countries of employment be adjusted as indicated in the attached proposal for a regulation

COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC, Euratom, ECSC)

adjusting the weightings applied to the remuneration and pensions of officials and other servants of the European Communities

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing a Single Council and a Single Commission of the European Communities.

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Communities laid down by Council Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68¹, as last amended by Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 3085/78², and in particular Articles 64, 65(2) and 82 of the Staff Regulations and the first paragraph of Article 20 and Article 64 of the Conditions of Employment,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas, by reason of the appreciable rise in the cost of living which took place since Council Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 3084/783 and (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 3086/784 came into force during the second half of 1978 in a number of countries where officials and other servants of the European Communities are employed. the weightings applied to the remuneration and pensions of officials and other servants should be adjusted with effect respectively from 1 January and 1 April 1979,

HAS ADOPTED THIS RECULATION:

Article 1

1. With effect from 1 January 1979, the weightings applicable to the remuneration of officals and other servants employed in the countries listed below shall be as follows:

Article 3

Article 5 of Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 3084/78 is repealed with effect from 1 January 1979.

Article 1 of Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 3086/78 plus corrigendum is repealed with effect from 1 April 1979.

Article 4

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
