ECSC TREATY TO GRANTING A GLOBAL LOAN TO "CLYDESDALE
BANK LIMITED", UNITED KINGDOM**

Subject: Request for assent, pursuant to Art. 56 2a) of the ECSC Treaty to granting a global loan to Clydesdale Bank Limited, United Kingdom.

I. THE INTERMEDIARY FINANCIAL AGENCY

No. 335

Applicant : Clydesdale Bank Limited,
United Kingdom.

Registered office : Glasgow

Parent company of applicant : Midland Bank Limited

II. BENEFICIARIES

: Small and medium-sized firms that extend existing facilities and/or generate new activities.

Field of activity of the beneficiaries : Industrial and service activities.

III. THE PROJECT

Procedure

The Commission will make £5 M (about 9.44 MioECU) available to Clydesdale Bank Limited. The loan will be disbursed within a period of three years in the number of tranches appropriate to the sub-loans approved. The sub-loans will be approved by the Commission's Services in accordance with the criteria and objectives published by the Commission (Official Journal No. C 178/2 of 27 July 1977 and Official Journal No. C 82/8 of 29 March 1979).

Clydesdale Bank Limited will report to the Commission annually on the use to which the global loan has been put. It will also report annually on the re-employment of ex-ECSC workers by the beneficiaries of the loan.

Global amount of the investment: £10M (+ 18.89 MioECU)

IV. THE REGION

Project location : The global loan will apply in all areas of Scotland which are affected by the rundown in coal and steel.

Unemployment rate : As per February 12, 1981
Central 12.1
Dumfries and Galloway 12.3
Fife 11.9
Lothian 9.7
Strathclyde 15.1

National aid status of project area : Assisted areas and/or steel conversion areas.

The ECSC industry has been an important source of employment in the area.

V. CONFORMITY WITH ART. 56 OF THE ECSC TREATY

ECSC redundancies in project area

: Since 1975 job losses in steel have totalled 9 250 located as follows: Glasgow (Tollcross, Cambuslang) 3 750, North Lanarkshire (Motherwell, Wishaw, Hamilton, Bellshill) 4 500, Garnoch Valley 1 000. As a result of further rationalisation of high-cost BSC plants, more marginal job losses from the 17 500 now employed by BSC in Scotland might occur. There have also been job losses in coal-mining over the past years, notably in Ayr, Grangemouth and Edinburgh.

Job creation of project

: At least 472 jobs suitable for former ECSC workers.

Training

: Through Manpower Services Commission and loan beneficiaries.

The Commission considers that the request complies with Art. 56 2a) of the ECSC Treaty.

VI. GLOBAL LOAN

Loan requested

: £5 M

Loan granted

: The Commission has approved a loan of £5 M (+ 9.44 MioECU) or equivalent to the above mentioned company in accordance with Art. 56 operating policies (O.J. No. C 82/8 of 29 March, 1979).

Interest rebate

: 3% points per year for five years on 9.44 MioECU

Job basis of interest rebate : 472 jobs suitable for and to be offered in priority to ex-ECSC workers.

VII. COUNCIL ASSENT

The Commission invites the Council to give its assent to the foregoing decision.
