I. THE COMPANY

<u>Applicant</u>

: Nordisk Færgefart A/S

Registered Office

: Faaborg

Parent company of applicant

: No parent company, shares are dispersed.

Recipient

: Nordisk Færgefart A/S

Field of activity of recipient

The company currently runs a ferry service between Denmark and Germany, using its ferry "Gelting Nord". Another ferry owned by the company, is chartered to the government of Trinidad and Tobago to be used as car ferry between the two islands.

II. THE PROJECT

Description

: The project involves the establishment of a car ferry service between Hundested, Denmark and Sandefjord, South Norway. The company will use the car ferry Gelting Nord for this route and will buy the motor

ferry "Stella Scarlet" at a cost of DKr 34 m to replace the "Gelting Nord" on the route Faaborg / Gelting.

Establishing cost for the new route amount in Norway to about NKs 2.5 m (about DKr 3.32 m) whilst the company's investment cost in Hundested will be about DKr 400.000 mainly for new buildings. To overhaul the ferry "Stella Scarlet" will cost the company another DKr 3.5 m.

DKR 41,2 (+ 5,07 MioECU)

Schedule

: The ferry route should become operational in 1983.

<u>Market</u>

: According to the company, the new route will benefit from the growth in transport between Hundested and Norway.

The new car ferry route will be an attractive alternative both from an economic and time-saving point of view, to the land route between Zealand and Norway, because the

only existing ferry route, the Copenhagen/Oslo route, can only take a limited number of private cars and lorries and is less attractive for transport to that part of Norway which lies South of Oslo.

Environment

: Environmental protection measures in accordance with current legislation

The sectoral and competition aspects of the project have been closely examined; they do not militate against the granting of the loan applied for.

The project appears to be economically sound; it will make a significant contribution to the redevelopment of the region which is suffering the effects of a decline in ECSC industries.

III. THE REGION

Project location

: Hundested, North Zealand, Danmark

Unemployment rate

In April 1982, the unemployment rate stood at 15.2 % in Hundested and 15.8 % in Frederiksværk. The corresponding rate for Denmark was 13.2 %.

National aid status of project area

: The area is not designated as assisted area.

The ECSC industry has been an important source of employment in the area.

IV. CONFORMITY WITH ARTICLE 56 OF THE ECSC TREATY

ECSC redundancies in project area

: There have been about 800 job losses at Danish steelworks (Det Danske Stalvalseværk, DDS) in Frederiksværk in the years 1980 and 1981.

Jobs to be created by the project

A minimum of 104 jobs in the Hundested area, where employment opportunities have been sharply reduced as a result of the reduction of jobs at the steelworks in Frederiksværk.

Training

Training will be provided by the company but many of the people dismissed or to be dismissed by DDS were formerly employed in ferry services and will thus be able to take up work with the ferry without further training.

The Commission considers that the application complies with Article 56 (2a) of the ECSC Treaty and that the new jobs to be created by the project are capable of absorbing redundant ECSC workers into productive employment.

V. CONVERSION LOAN

Loan applied for

: DKR 14 m

Loan to be granted

: The Commission has approved a loan of DKR 14 m (about 1.72 MioECU) or equivalent to the above mentioned company in accordance with Article 56 application criteria (OJ C 82, 29 March 1979)

Interest rebate

: 3 percentage points per year for five years on 1.72 MioECU.

Job basis of interest rebate

: 86 jobs suitable for former ECSC industry workers, to whom they will be offered in priority.

VI. COUNCIL ASSENT
