I. THE COMPANY

; : Caledonian Airmotive Ltd.

Registered Office

: Prestwick, Scotland

Parent company of applicant

: Caledonian Aviation Group, a public limited company which also owns British Caledonian Airways Ltd.

Recipient

: Caledonian Airmotive Ltd.

Field of activity of recipient

: The Company's business is the overhaul and refurbishment of jet engines and it is presently equipped to overhaul only one product, which is the General Electric Co. CF6-50 jet engine currently used in the

McDonnell Douglas DC 10-30, Boeing 747 and Airbus A 300 commercial aircraft. The company has limited facility for high technology repairs at this time. Overhaul operations commenced in February 1980.

### II. THE PROJECT

#### Description

:The project comprises two independant constituant parts, being the introduction of facilities for the overhaul and refurbishment of the Pratt and Whitney JT 8D series engine, and expansion of the high technology repair capability to reduce the company's dependance on US sub-contractors.

#### Market

The Pratt and Whitney JT8 engine is the world's most successful and popular engine with some 7.600 in operation worldwide. It therefore provides the company with a wider and more diverse market base, since there are numerous operations both in U.K., Europe and Middle East and Africa.

#### <u>Environment</u>

: Environmental protection measures in accordance with current legislation

The sectoral and competition aspects of the project have been closely examined; they do not militate against the granting of the loan applied for.

The project appears to be economically sound; it will make a significant contribution to the redevelopment of the region which is suffering the effects of a decline in ECSC industries.

### III. THE REGION

Project location

: Prestwick, Ayrshire, Strathclyde region, Scotland

Unemployment rate

In North Ayrshire, total unemployment was 20 % in January 1982. The position is particularly severe for men with male unemployment now at 24.3 %.

National aid status of project area

: Special Development area.

The ECSC industry has been an important source of employment in the area.

### IV. CONFORMITY WITH ARTICLE 56 OF THE ECSC TREATY

ECSC redundancies in project area

: The decline in iron and steel employment has been particularly rapid in Strathclyde in the more recent period, and it is estimated that a fall of over 12.000 jobs has occurred in the region since 1976.

Jobs to be created by the project

: 235

Training

: A comprehensive training plan has been developed which will provide for on and off the job training.

The Commission considers that the application complies with Article 56 (2a) of the ECSC Treaty and that the new jobs to be created by the project are capable of absorbing redundant ECSC workers into productive employment.

### V. CONVERSION LOAN

Loan applied for

: ± 2 m

Loan to be granted

: The Commission has approved a loan of E 2 m (about 3.518 MioECU) or equivalent to the above mentioned company in accordance with Article 56 application criteria (OJ C 82, 29 March 1979)

Interest rebate

: 3 percentage points per year for five years on 3.4 MioECU.

Job basis of interest rebate

: 170 joks suitable for former ECSC industry workers, to whom they will be offered in priority.

## VI. COUNCIL ASSENT

The Commission requests the Council to give its assent to the foregoing decision,
