## II. THE PROJECT

### Description

: The project is the construction of a modern "4-star" hotel in the new city centre of Cardiff, with health club, swimming pool and sauna facilities.

### Schedule

: 1983 to mid-1985

### Market

: A detailed feasibility study and marketing exercise by the company has established that a need exists for a hotel facility of this type in the Cardiff city centre where no comparable facility now exists. A Cardiff City Council Urban Development grant has been approved.

### Environment

: Environmental protection measures in accordance with current legislation

The sectoral and competition aspects of the project have been closely examined ; they do not militate against the granting of the loan applied for.

The project appears to be economically sound ; it will make a significant contribution to the redevelopment of the region which is suffering the effects of a decline in ECSC industries.

V. CONVERSION LOAN

=====

Loan applied for : UK£ 4 million

Loan to be granted : The Commission has approved a loan of UK£ 4 million (about 6.82 MioECU) or equivalent to the above mentioned company (1).

Interest rebate : 3 percentage points per year for five years on 1.5 MioECU.

Job basis of interest rebate : 75 jobs suitable for former ECSC industry workers, to whom they will be offered in priority.
