

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing a Single Council and a Single
Commission of the European Communities,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of
Employment of Other Servants of the European Communities laid down by
Council Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68¹, as last amended by
Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 161/80², and in particular Article 13
of Annex VII to the Staff Regulations and Articles 22 and 67 of the Conditions
of Employment,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas, in view of the increased costs recorded in the different places of
employment in the Member States, the rates of daily subsistence allowance for
officials on mission should be adjusted,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Article 13 of Annex VII to the Staff Regulations is hereby amended as follows:

1. The scale in paragraph 1(a) is replaced by the following:

2. Paragraph 2 is amended to read as follows:

"2. In addition to the rates set out in Column I of the foregoing scale, the hotel bill covering room, service and taxes, but excluding breakfast shall be reimbursed up to a maximum of Bfrs 950 for Greece, Bfrs 1 400 for Denmark, France, Italy and Luxembourg, Bfrs 1 500 for the Netherlands and Ireland, Bfrs 1 700 for Belgium and the United Kingdom and Bfrs 1 800 for the Federal Republic of Germany. Where a hotel bill is not produced, a fixed sum equivalent to 40% of the amounts specified above shall be paid to the official, except where he has incurred reimbursable sleeper costs or has not had to spend the night away from his place of employment."

3. In paragraph 3 the words "by Bfrs 330 and Bfrs 315 respectively" are replaced by "by 25%".

4. The second subparagraph of paragraph 8 is amended to read as follows:

"The daily subsistence allowance shall be reduced by 23% of the allowance provided for in Column I and 16% of the allowance provided for in Columns II and III for each meal provided; the allowances provided for in Columns II and III shall be reduced by 34% for each day's accommodation provided. Where an official on mission has all his meals and accommodation provided or reimbursed by one of the institutions of the Communities or by a national or international administration or organization, he shall receive in place of the daily subsistence allowance for missions provided for above an allowance of 26% of the allowance provided for in Column I or 17% of the allowances provided for in Columns II and III."

5. Paragraph 9 is deleted.

6. In paragraph 10, which becomes paragraph 9, the words "in paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 8 and 9" are replaced by "in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 8."

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

EVALUATION DE L'INCIDENCE FINANCIERE

- Nombre de missions en 1980, liquidées à Bruxelles : 27.800 dossiers
- Montant du crédit engagé en indemnités : \pm 138.780.000 FB
- Répartition du crédit selon la destination :
 - Hors d'Europe des "9" \pm 64% = 88.819.200
 - Europe des "9" \pm 36% = 49.960.800
- Répartition des missions selon la destination :
 - Hors d'Europe des "9" \pm 45% ou 12.510 dossiers
 - Europe des "9" \pm 55% ou 15.290 dossiers
- Estimation de la répartition des missions entre les différents grades à l'intérieur de l'Europe des "9" en 1980 :
 - A/1-A/3 30% des missions
 - A/4-B 55% des missions
 - C-D 15% des missions

L'application des taux proposés sur l'année budgétaire 1980 sur base des données ci-dessus aurait entraîné une augmentation de la dépense de 1,644% ou 821.350 FB.

L'application d'un nouveau taux pour la Grèce n'entraîne pas une augmentation des dépenses.

CONCLUSION

Tenant compte d'un accroissement annuel de 9% du nombre de missions et à condition que l'adaptation prenne effet au 1.4.81 l'incidence financière pour l'année budgétaire 1981 peut être estimée à 596.850 FB pour le poste 1301 Bruxelles et à 648.370 FB pour le poste budgétaire 1301 (Bruxelles, Luxembourg, Office des Publications) in globo.
