In accordance with the provisions of Article 99 of the Staff Regulations, the appointing authority has granted, for 1983, bonuses for exceptional service to certain officials and temporary staff who occupy a post in the field of nuclear science calling for scientific or technical qualifications and who are paid from research and investment appropriations. The bonus unit is Bfrs 50 000.

The recipients have been selected on the following criteria:

- (a) outstanding work, usually published (excluding patented and exploited inventions, which are covered by Article 94 of the Staff Regulations);
- (b) high-level performance (sustained efforts in connection with experiments
- (c) special behaviour under particular circumstances (industrial accident, fire, contamination).

Annex III

Number of recipients of bonuses, by category and selection criterion.

The Commission draws particular attention to the fact that it has kept within the limits fixed in the Staff Regulations for the aggregate amount and for the individual amount of the bonuses awarded. The regulation limit for the aggregate amount is 3% of total basic salaries paid to scientific and technical staff, and the actual figure for 1983 is 0.1861%; the limit for unit value is three times the amount of the basic monthly salary.

ANNEX II

STATISTICS

1. The basic salaries paid to scientific and technical staff for 1983 amounted to approximately Bfrs 3 CO7 738 823.

The bonuses awarded for exceptional services totalled Bfrs 5 600 000 (budget allocation: 122 000 ECU, or Bfrs 5 606 120 at November 1983 rate).

2. 2 015 officials and temporary staff were classed as scientific or technical staff on 31 May 1983.

92 bonuses were awarded (of which 76 were one-unit bonuses, 11 were two-unit, 4 were three-unit and one was a double bonus).

3. The above figures show that:
